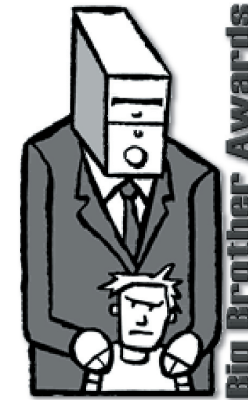

### Big Brother Awards



The APF runs Australia's annual Big Brother Awards, also known as the 'Orwells'.

The awards are for corporations, public officials and governments that have shown a blatant disregard for privacy.

The awards also feature categories for individuals and organisations who have made a major positive contribution to protecting the privacy of Australians.

Each year, the national members and affiliated organisations of Privacy International present Big Brother Awards in their countries. Since 1998, over 50 ceremonies have been held in 16 countries. Australia's first ceremony was in 2003.
